- Page 18. FIRST COMMUNION AT HOLY NAME. Children from the Alestra, Caltabiano, Childs, Dahllof, Dalton, Dougherty, Gallagher, O'Reilly, Schaefer, and Sheehan families gathered under the watchful eye of the Rev. Jerome Piontkowski at the altar in Holy Name Church for their First Communion photograph in 1954.
- Page 19. **MOUNT CALVARY BAPTIST CHURCH.** In 1905 the cornerstone was laid for the first African American church in Mullica Hill on High Street. The small church on a hill reminded the members of Calvary, so they named it Mount Calvary. The congregation first met for services in members' homes, then in Old Town Hall. This sanctuary served the congregation until 1976, when the present building was erected.
- Page 25. French Lodge #89, Independent Order of Odd Fellows. French Lodge was instituted in 1849 and named in honor of Captain Samuel Gibbs French, hailed at the time as a local Mexican-American War hero. In 1853 they dedicated their first lodge hall, located on the third floor of a building that once stood on South Main Street, south of First Baptist Church. Today the Lodge meets in Richwood Academy and is the township's oldest civic organization.
- Page 120. **Building Clearview.** Faced with growing populations, Harrison and Mantua Townships requested approval in 1958 to form a regional district for 7th-12th grades. A group of young people who would attend the new school broke ground in 1959: Susan Barrett, John Lippincott, Mary Beth Muhlbaier (front, left to right); Toby Gegenheimer, Barbara Boone, Paul Reitz, Joanne Moore, Kenneth Vogt, Brian Nealy (middle row); Superintendent Ward Broomall, Edwin Brumbaugh, architect, Marvin Harris, board members Melvin Boone and Norman Thompson, Joan White and County Superintendent J. Harvey Shue (back row). Around the same time, South Harrison joined Kingsway Regional and Elk, Delsea Regional. (MM.)
- Page 124. **ANTIQUE COUNTRY.** Mullica Hill's reputation as an antiques center began in the late 1960s when Hillcreek House opened at 32 North Main Street. By the 1970s shops proliferated throughout the village, which became widely known throughout the Northeast. These businesses also awakened recognition of the town's heritage, resulting in the Mullica Hill Historic District. (GCHS.)
- Page 126. **OPENING THE BYPASS.** January 12, 2012, marked the culmination of decades of planning to alleviate traffic congestion through Mullica Hill's Historic District. Committeemen Matthew Diggons, Robert Shearer and Don Heim, Mayor Lou Manzo, Freeholder Heather Simmons, NJ Senate President Steve Sweeney, Freeholder Robert Damminger, State Senator Donald Norcross, Freeholder Joe Chila, former mayor Mike Koestler and Sheriff Carmel Morina cut the ribbon to open the long-awaited 322 By-Pass. (SJT.)
